



THE FA CUP FINAL WITH BUDWEISER

MANCHESTER CITY



The 132nd FA Cup has reached its Final stage, with two teams left from the original entry of 758. The competition began with an 'Extra Preliminary Round' nine months ago. Wembley, old and new, has now hosted 78 Final matches (plus five replays), the last of which saw Chelsea defeat Liverpool courtesy of goals from Ramires and Didier Drogba.

PROGRESSION

Carlos Tevez and Gareth Barry gave City a two-goal advantage against Watford in a home Third Round tie before 17-year-old substitute Marcos Lopes made it 3-0 at the end. City then won a hard-fought Fourth Round tie at Stoke with Pablo Zabaleta's goal five minutes from time to bring Cup-fighters Leeds United to the Etihad. City were 2-0 up in 16 minutes through Yaya Toure and Sergio Agüero and then finished comfortably with further strikes from Tevez and Agüero. It was Argentinian superstar Tevez who inspired the reigning Premier League champions to a 5-0 home romp against Barnsley from the Championship in Round Six. He scored a hat-trick while Aleks Kolarov and David Silva contributed the other goals. City held off a Semi-Final fight back by Chelsea after taking an early two-goal lead through Samir Nasri and Sergio Agüero. Demba Ba's 66th-minute strike gave Chelsea hope but City made it through to their tenth final.

Public Transport:

Train: For the Saturday of The FA Cup Final, there is a normal timetable in operation on May 11. The last train from Euston Station to Manchester will depart at 21.00 and is timetabled to arrive at 23.38.

Wembley Stadium is also serviced by Wembley Central and Wembley Stadium mainline train stations. Both stations provide services towards the Midlands and are additional options for fans travelling down from the North West. Trains from Birmingham Moor Street go into Wembley Stadium station and are serviced by Chiltern Railways. Trains from Milton Keynes and Watford Junction go into Wembley Central station and are serviced by London Midland.

London Underground: Wembley Stadium is serviced by two tube lines, the Jubilee Line and the Metropolitan line. Both lines stop at Wembley Park which is the stop to alight at for the Stadium.

Car:

Wembley Stadium is a public transport destination and parking is limited. We recommend you only use official Stadium parking and book in advance to avoid disappointment. FRAUDULENT TICKETS

Fortress bar coding will be used to detect fraudulent tickets and stolen tickets, where notified. The Stadium has recently witnessed on certain matches an above average number of supporters in possession of fraudulent tickets. All supporters should purchase tickets from registered sources only and notify The FA if they become aware of fraudulent tickets.

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR

Mind your language:

The FA will investigate all allegations of abuse. If you experience a Racist, anti-Semitic, Islamophobic, homophobic or transphobic incident at the match please report it to the Police or a Steward.

Wembley Stadium treats anti-social behaviour seriously and expects all visitors to treat staff and fellow visitors with Respect. However, if you experience anti-social behaviour close to you, please send a text to 87474 with the relevant keyword: Foul (Language and behaviour); Racism (Racist chanting and shouting); HPH (Homophobic chanting); Drink (Drinking alcohol in view of the pitch); Smoke (Smoking in the Stadium); Stand (Standing up), along with your location and the location of the offence – Block, Row, Seat. Each message costs one standard message at your local rate.

Prohibited items:

The following must not be brought within the Ground: knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. It is standard procedure that all bags will be searched upon entering the Stadium.
